Here in Bath, where 70 per cent of us voted Remain and 12,500 signed the petition for a second referendum, our MP has a much slimmer majority. Ben Howlett argued for staying in the EU before the referendum; Bath for Europe believes he should respect the strength of opinion in Bath and continue the fight.

Of all the options we have – from 'soft' to 'hard' to suicidal – it's increasingly clear that the best deal we can get from our fellow Europeans is the one we already have.
